Dear PHS Student and Guardian:

The end of the first semester is approaching which means semester exams are almost here. Due to the length of some of the exams, we adjust our regularly followed schedule and give the exams over a two-day period. Please note, the exam days begin with all teachers in the building for their individual plan period. This schedule assures all teachers receive their required planning period and allows our students a little extra time to prepare themselves on testing day. If a student is absent or fails to finish in the allotted time, this 1st period will be used to finish an exam or take a missed exam.

Busses will run at the usual times. When bus riders arrive at school, they will report to the cafeteria and library for a supervised study session. All other students are <u>not</u> required to arrive at school until their first exam is scheduled to begin. Students who have classes off-campus may arrive at 3rd hour. In addition, off-campus students will be allowed to leave if they do not have an exam to take during the time PHS students are testing. Students enrolled in a virtual in-person class, such as Health, will attend the entire class period. If students finish a final early, they must stay until the period ends.

Keep in mind the importance of semester exams. These tests are the cumulative measurement of student growth in each class for the entire semester. Semester exams are weighted more heavily (% of the semester grade) than chapter or unit tests. Students should begin test preparation immediately and continue until exam day.

New school policy can qualify a student to not take a final exam. The handbook states students with qualifying grades, attendance, and behavior may be excused from one or more exams. They must see their teacher or me if they qualify. Some semester exams are mandatory whether a student qualifies or not (i.e. dual credit courses).

Students are not being punished if they take finals but rather, good behavior/ attendance/grades are being rewarded. Students not taking finals due to qualifying will be given the average score between the two quarters in place of the finals. Students who take only a portion of their finals can come all day or sign in during the final period. For example, a student may only have their 4th-hour final. They can go to through their normal schedule or arrive to begin 4th hour and must stay until the bell rings.

Finals Policy

A student can qualify to not take a final exam. Students with qualifying grades, attendance, and behavior may be excused from one or more exams. The following are different considerations for students who must take final exams.

Grades:

• If a student has a C+ (79.44) or lower grade in <u>either</u> quarter, the student must take the final exam in that class.

Attendance:

 Any student who has 6 or more absences, excused or unexcused, in a class per semester must take the final exam in that class. Professional absences (i.e. college visits or school academic/athletic trips) do not count toward the total.

Tardies:

• Any student who accumulates 5 or more tardies will take ALL finals.

Academic Behavior:

 Academic dishonesty (cheating, plagiarism, fabrication, falsification, or similar misconduct) will result in taking a final in that class. Rationale is academic dishonesty at different levels of education may result in failing a class, being dismissed from a major, or expulsion from the university.

Behavior:

• Any student who has at least 1-in school suspension, 3 detentions (before, lunch, or after school), 3 behavior logs, a combination of discipline, or other multiple policy violations will take the final exam in that class.

Advanced Placement:

• Students enrolled in AP or Dual Credit College Course may be required to take final exams as part of the college course requirement. Courses in those situations, we are unable to let students opt out of those exams.

NOTE: Students who are exempt from finals may choose to take any or all finals. If their optional final result is lower than the two-quarter average, the final will not be input into the system.

REMINDER: Finals are standard and not a punishment. Most high schools and colleges require finals, as does Palestine High School. We believe this policy is a positive way to reward students for good grades/behavior/attendance. We hope the policy will move more students toward better marks in education.
